Obviously not! However, if I ask people who have taken a more traditional or blended course to use Chat2learn to strengthen and/or reinvigorate the acquired knowledge, I could get measurable benefits. I could for example train the chatbot to administer quizzes, case studies etc. and evaluate, based on the answers given, to what extent students really master the skills they should have acquired in the traditional or blended course."
